

Our Students' Presence Is Everything

We are so blessed each day to spend the time we do with our students engaged in learning, prayer, and growing together as a Catholic community. As we approached the end of the school year in 2024-2025, I shared with our school board a desire to see our students' attendance improve over the course of the next school year. Prior to the start of school, I issued a challenge to our students and parents to make our best efforts to be at school each day so that we could get the most out of our academics and our spiritual growth. As I look at our attendance at the end of the 1st Quarter, it is very positive! Our high school attendance has been solid at 94.66% so far this year. That is just below the 95.22% we were at last year at this time. Our MS, however, is doing outstanding work! Last year, at the 1st Quarter break, our middle school attendance was at 94.03%. Currently, our middle school students' attendance is at 96.22%! That is a difference of 86 fewer total days of school missed this year versus last year. Keep it up!

Gaels Students Enjoying the Arts

On Wednesday, October 15, our students were able to attend the Fall play at Iowa Central Community College. Our entire middle school student body and our high school choir students saw The Brother's Grimm Spectaculathon performed by the Triton drama students. Also, this month, on October 8, St. Edmond hosted the Catholic Choral Festival in the newly renovated St. Edmond gymnasium. The 250+ students participated in a vocal clinic during the day, which culminated with a concert that night featuring songs performed by the massive choir and performances from each individual choir.
